

Director's Message:

Library funding has been in the news a lot lately. On March 14, President Trump issued an Executive Order to dismantle the federal agency dedicated to funding library services, the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), as well as six other agencies. You can view the full order here: https://tinyurl.com/49ymf6ce/. On March 31, 2025 all IMLS staff were placed on a 90-day administrative leave.

What does this mean for Collingswood Public Library and other public libraries? While Collingswood Library -- like most public libraries -- receives the bulk of its funding from local taxes, federal funding through IMLS supports many functions of State Libraries, including the New Jersey State Library (NJSL).

NJSL annually receives approximately \$4.5 million from IMLS through the Grants to States program. A total of 20 people at NJSL are in Grants to States program-related jobs, working on large and smaller scale initiatives that include: The Talking Book and Braille Center, the only NJ library geared exclusively to serving the state's Blind and print-disabled population; JerseyConnect, which provides integrated technology services for libraries, including internet and managed Wi-Fi services, email hosting, network access and cloud services; and online databases.* Collingswood Public Library and its patrons benefit from all of the resources listed above.


Friends meet on the Second Monday of the month at 5.30 pm in the Director's office.
